Terry Fox Run Friday September 28 9:30



No Smoking

The use of tobacco products in school buildings and on school property is now against the law! In March, the B.C. Legislature approved legislation making it illegal to smoke or use tobacco products

at school. This ban is effective September 2007 and applies to everyone – students, staff, parents and the public.

Previously, it was against school district policy to smoke in schools or on school grounds, but the policy allowed for some exceptions. The new law will not allow for any exceptions and will include students, staff, parents and



visitors during regular school hours, extracurricular activities and weekends. We will be posting signs on our buildings and grounds reminding everyone about the ban. We are asking for the cooperation of students, staff, parents and the general public in respecting this new law.
