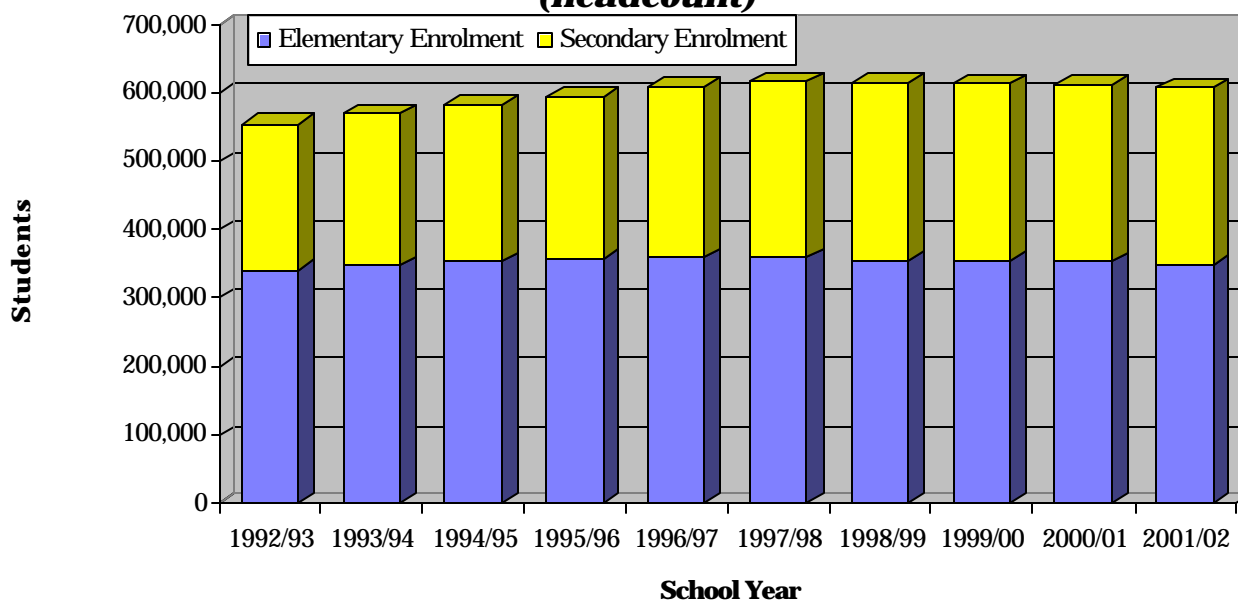

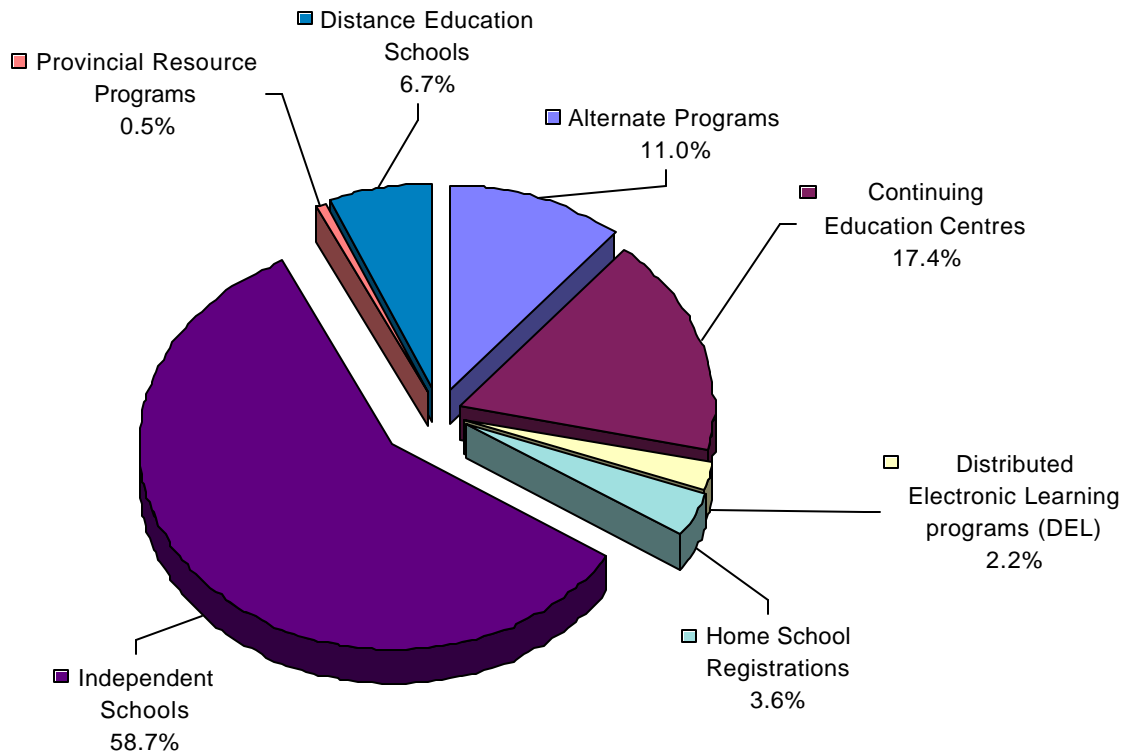

## Student Distribution In Alternative Programs (Standard Schools Not Included)

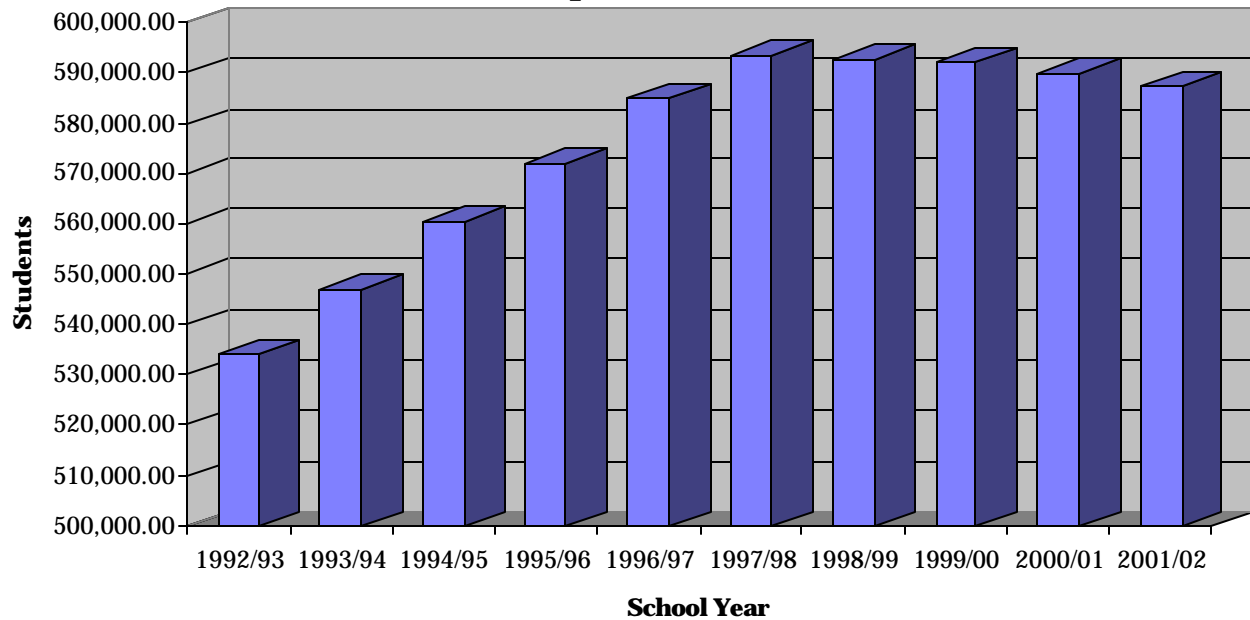

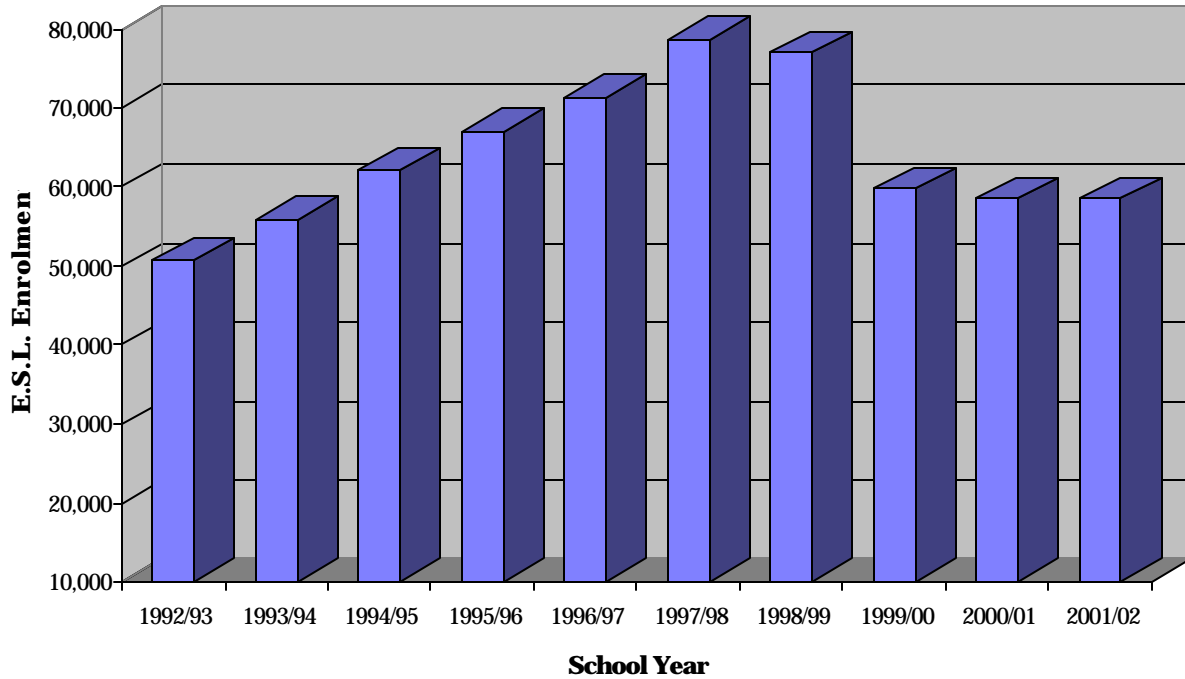

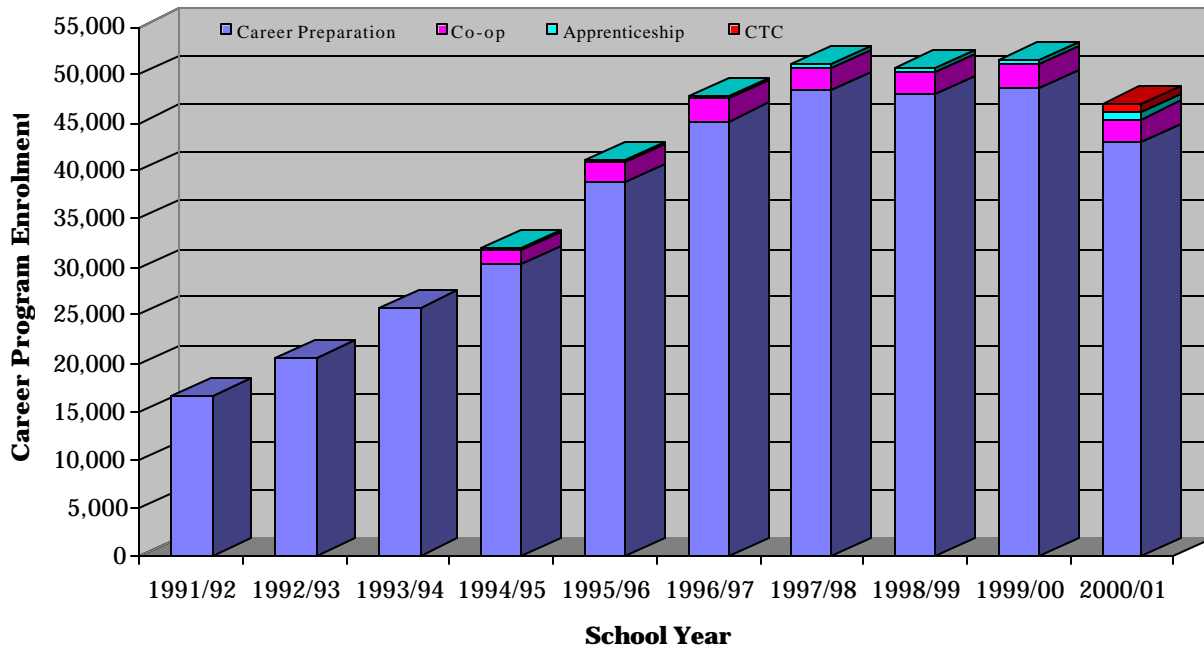

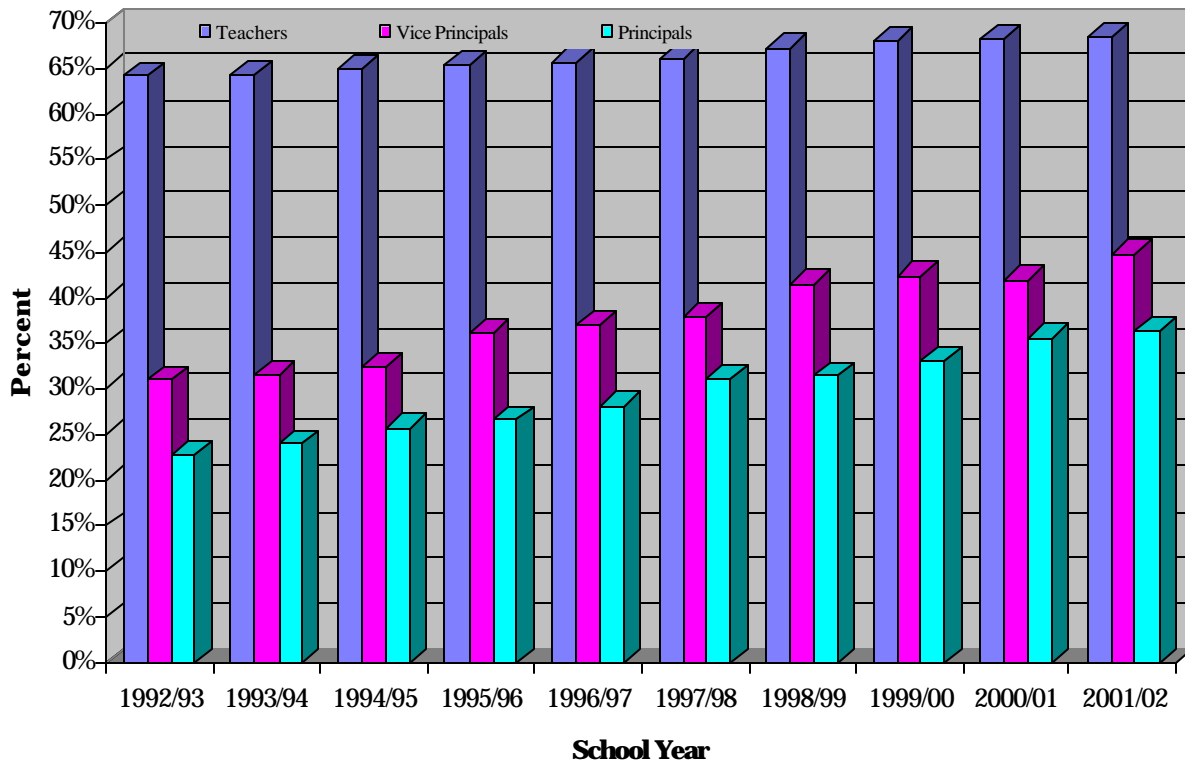
